

The European Society for Pediatric Nephrology (ESPN) was funded in 1967 and this represented a true milestone for Pediatric Nephrology in Europe. Presently about 2,000 doctors are estimated to be involved at different extent in the care of children with renal disease all over Europe, working in interactive communication through personal contacts and groups with peculiar activities. This process is highly facilitated by the annual ESPN Congress, which has more than 500 attendees and the ESPN network which has been recently greatly expanded. One third of the whole group of European Pediatric Nephrologists works in to 200 specialized centers in tertiary care hospitals, while about two thirds work in secondary pediatric care and have developed a particular interest and skill in the most frequent renal diseases. Pediatric Nephrology has experts in each European Country.

The aim of the Society is to promote research knowledge of paediatric nephrology through teaching, scientific meetings and other methods, for the benefit of children with renal disease.

#### **CLIMATE**

The climate of Scotland is temperate, and tends to be changeable. Winters are usually cold, but don't begin until the end of October. Summers are warm and begin in the end/mid of June. September is usually mild with an average temperature of 13°C. Be prepared in case of rain.

#### **CREDIT CARDS**

Major credit cards are widely accepted in hotels, stores, cafés and restaurants.

#### ATM/CASH MACHINES

ATM's offer a convenient way of withdrawing Pounds (£) on a credit or debit card. Most banks have these machines, and all major cards are accepted (be sure to have your PIN code). There is a cash machine inside the Scottish Event Campus.

#### **BANKS & FOREIGN EXCHANGE OFFICES,**

Banks typically open 9:30 to 16:00 or 17:00 from Monday to Friday, although some open slightly later on Thursday evenings and a few branches may open on Saturday morning until 12:30. Outside banking hours you'll have to use a foreign exchange office, which can be found in the city centre and also at the airport and railway stations.



#### **CURRENCY**

The local currency is the Pound Sterling and the sign for the Pound is £ (GBP). Please note that the three main Scottish banks (Bank of Scotland, Royal Bank of Scotland and Clydesdale) each issue their own sterling notes which will look slightly different but are universally accepted in the UK.

#### **ELECTRICITY**

The UK, Scotland and Republic of Ireland use a 13 amp plug with 3 rectangular pins which is different to the rest of Europe. As such, an adaptor may be needed depending on the country you are coming from.






