Dear Members

I hope that the beginning of the summer has been nice for all of you. In Scandinavia we had a warm and bright mid-summer with all its celebrations. The last ESPN meeting in Istanbul was a big success also economically and we had a profit of 25.000 USD. I once more want to thank the organizers. Our economy has slowly improved and enables us to get the registry going with a half-time secretary from August 2006.



The ESPN-council met in Heidelberg May 18 - 19, 2006, hosted by Franz Schaefer. The big decision was to appoint a half-time secretary for the paediatric part of the registry in Amsterdam. Without any personnel we cannot keep the registry working, nor perform any studies, which would be a pity as most European countries now are reporting. ERA has promised a 10.000 € support and Roche and Novartis Scandinavia have both contributed. In addition to this the following national societies have promised to help; Germany, France, Switzerland and Italy. Thus, the council decided to appoint a person from August 2006 for two years to begin with. In Palermo the presidents of the national societies will meet and we will work out a formula according to which each country would contribute on a regular basis. ESPN has to be registered somewhere in Europe, to make it possible to apply for funding from the EU. Already now we are part of an ERA EU grant application. Jane Tizard and Bert van der Heijden have done a great work in establishing the paediatric registry and now also in making appointing a competent person possible. Bert cannot be re-elected and we have to find a substitute for him in Palermo to represent us on the ERA-registry committee.

In Palermo we also have to elect our Secretary General, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer for the next year and three council members (Franz Schaefer, Necla Buyan and Alan Watson) are finishing their term. Pierre Cochat, Peter Hoyer and myself are prepared to continue for one more year, the council members cannot be re-elected. In 2007 Pierre Cochat is also going to be the President Elect as the 2008 ESPN meeting will be in Lyon. I ask our members to make suggestions for these offices before the middle of July in writing signed by three members. You can make your preliminary suggestions by e-mail and send the written one later if you wish.

IPNA is also looking for a new treasurer and the search committee has been in contact with the council and we have suggested some of our experienced members as potential candidates. The following representatives for Europe will also finish their term on the IPNA council; A Bakkaloglu (Turkey), S Rigden (U.K.), F Santos (Spain) and A Tsygin (Russia). The ESPN council has suggested that they be replaced by Franz Schaefer (Germany), Alan Watson (U.K.), Igor Zorin (Russia) and Yaacov Frishberg (Israel).



On April 6 – 8, 2006 ESPN arranged a Teaching and Training course in Minsk, Belarus. The local President professor Alexander Sukalo and his team, especially Ina Kozyra, had

About 300 doctors and trainees from Belarus and the neighbouring countries participated, the technical facilities and the interpretation were perfect and we visited the wards and had a lot of interaction. ESPN speakers were Willem Proesmans, Rosanna Coppo, Albert Bensmann and myself. Willem Proesmans has already for



many years done a great job in supporting our colleagues in Minsk and we had an unforgettable time with great hospitality.

ESPN has been asked to coordinate a symposium on Paediatric nephrology at the 25th International Congress of Paediatrics in Athens August 25 – 30, 2007. Peter Hoyer and Dinos Stefanidis will coordinate the symposium and speakers will be, in addition to them, Franz Schaefer, Alan Watson and Pierre Cochat.

The General Assembly will be in Palermo on the 9^{th} of October at 12 noon. The registry committee will meet on the 8^{th} at 1 p.m. and the national presidents on the 9^{th} at 5 p.m. . Important matters for the future for ESPN will be to register somewhere in Europe to get a legal status, to establish a regular income for the registry secretary, updating our training syllabus and preparing an ESPN visitation program, establishing regular contacts with the presidents of the national societies and modernizing our website. Committees have been established for these activities.

Finally, I want to welcome you all, and all your non-ESPN member colleagues, to Palermo in October. Silvio Maringhini, Alan Watson and Giovanni Montini have done a great job and we have an excellent scientific program. I visited Palermo last week, the location is splendid and as you can see from the following pages the area is full of historical sites, churches, palaces and sandy beaches. You will have a perfect opportunity to enjoy top science in a most spectacular setting. Close to 300 participants, some from far away countries, have already registered, 514 abstracts were received and 20 grants for young investigators have been approved. On the next two pages you have more information about the 40th ESPN meeting in Palermo. Please, feel free to contact Silvio or myself if you have any questions.

Connection Airport/Hotels/Airport and Hotel Congress Venue

and 30 km. from the city of Palermo and there is no public buses connecting the airport and/or the city of Palermo to the Congress Venue.

Therefore we have included in the hotel reservation package transfer from the airport to the proposed hotels and viceversa (Hotel Torre Normanna and Hotel Zagarella & Sea Palace) and also a daily service of navette from the Hotel Zagarella & Sea Palace to the Congress Venue (a.m. for the start and p.m. at the end of the scientific sessions).

Kindly note that only Participants who have booked the hotel through the Congress Organising Secretariat will be allowed to use the transfer and the navette buses.
